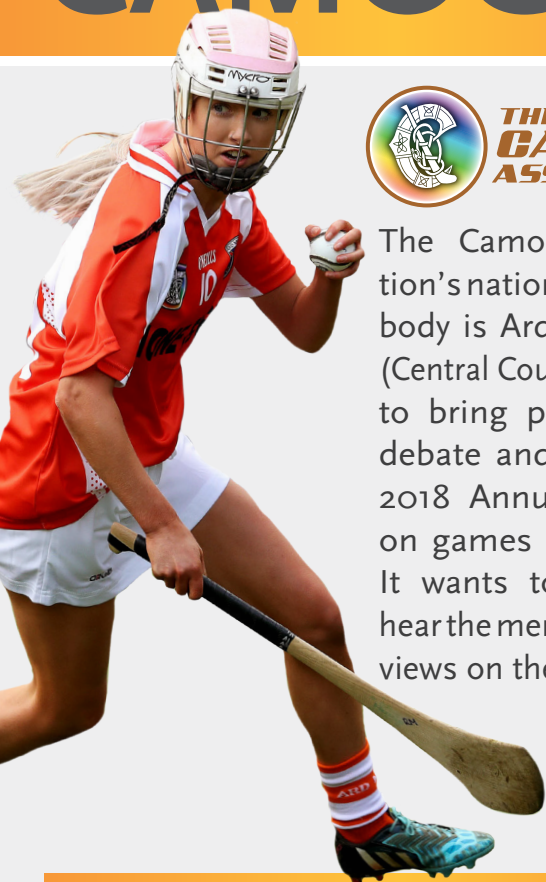


TALKING CAMOGIE

Players, referees, coaches, managers, mentors, administrators – have your say on changes to the game. You are invited to attend any session of your choice.



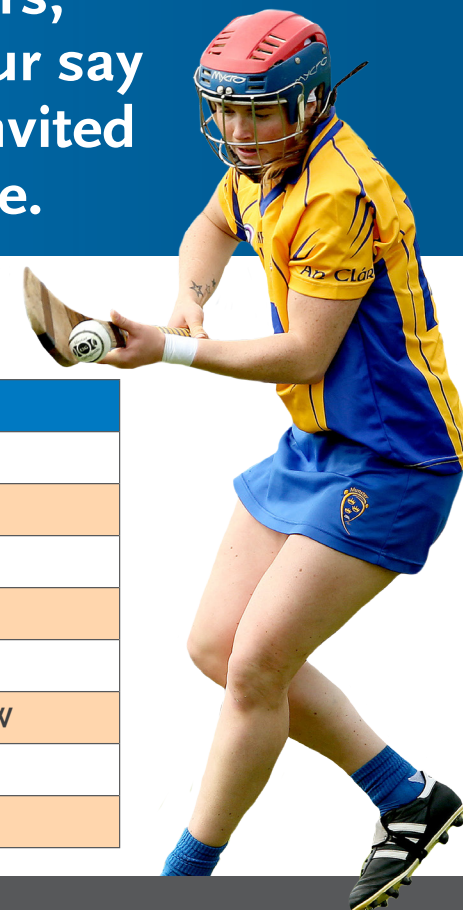
THE CAMOGIE ASSOCIATION

WHAT ABOUT THE PLAYING RULES?

- Different colour jersey for the goalkeeper
- Skorts for all or shorts for some or all
- Defining physical contact
- Better regulating the charge
- Disallow/allow shouldering

WHAT ARE THE MAIN IDEAS?

- 1 That a player has to be aged over 16 to be eligible to play adult club camogie (currently it's over 15).
- 2 That a player has to be aged over 18 to play adult intercounty Camogie and that the move towards this would be phased in (currently it's over 16).
- 3 That the All-Ireland Minor championship would change from its current national open draw structure to a Provincial structure with Connacht counties being accommodated in an equitable system.
